



Remote Education Information for Parents

This information is intended to provide clarity and transparency to pupils and parents or carers about what to expect from remote education if local restrictions require entire cohorts (or bubbles) to remain at home.

The remote curriculum: what is taught to pupils at home

A pupil's first day or two of being educated remotely might look different from our standard approach, while we take all necessary actions to prepare for a longer period of remote teaching.

What should my child expect from immediate remote education on the first day or two of pupils being sent home?

All children will have access to the '[Google Classroom](#)' via their school email address. Their log in details can be found in their pupil planner (KS2) or reading record (KS1). This is their school email address and password they have created. (School email address is year they started reception, followed by first name initial and surname i.e 19jbloggs@wesberryfederation.org.uk).

Children will receive a suggested timetable (example below) for the 'home schooling' day within the first two days of closure. Links for any 'meetings' will be attached to their google calendar. A help sheet of how to join a Google Meet/ Hangout can be found on our website.

Following the first few days of remote education, will my child be taught broadly the same curriculum as they would if they were in school?

Lessons will be available on Google Classroom that closely reflect the same curriculum remotely as we do in school.

We will teach the same curriculum remotely as we do in school wherever possible and appropriate. However, we have needed to make some adaptations in some subjects. For example some subjects will be web based activities.

Remote teaching and study time each day

How long can I expect work set by the school to take my child each day?

We expect that remote education (including remote teaching and independent work) will take pupils broadly the following number of hours each day:

**Staff will advise you if this is any different for your child.*

Accessing remote education

How will my child access any online remote education you are providing?

The children will access the work via our **Google Classroom**. Additional links to websites and online platforms may be attached to the classroom if needed for individual subjects.


Your child will already be attached to a number of different Google Classrooms. These will cover English, Numeracy and all of the wider curriculum subjects (see below for classrooms available to each year group).

If my child does not have digital or online access at home, how will you support them to access remote education?

We recognise that some pupils may not have suitable online access at home. We take the following approaches to support those pupils to access remote education:

Chrome books may be borrowed on loan basis for the lockdown/ isolation period – this will need to be arranged and recorded by the class teacher. Parents should organise their own insurance to cover potential damage whilst the chrome book is being used at home. There is also a small number of KS1 chrome books for some children to borrow.

Parents can request printed materials needed if they do not have online access. These will be left in a '**drop box**' at the school gate and staff will liaise with parents when to collect.

How will my child be taught remotely?

We use a combination of the following approaches to teach pupils remotely:

- Some recorded teaching – this will be either by staff members or nationally available materials. All links will be found on the Google Classroom.
- Printed paper packs produced by teachers if requested (due to no online access)
- Reading books sent home
- Commercially available websites supporting the teaching of specific subjects or areas, including video clips or sequences – these will be attached if needed to the Google Classroom.
- Some live teaching (online lessons)

Engagement and feedback

What are your expectations for my child's engagement and the support that we as parents and carers should provide at home?

The expectation is that ALL pupils must engage fully with online learning.
Parents need to help children find a quiet and organised space to work.
Help your child be prepared for the day with resources needed and remind them of the school expectations using the given timetable.

How will you check whether my child is engaging with their work and how will I be informed if there are concerns? How will you assess my child's work and progress?

Additional support for pupils with particular needs

How will you work with me to help my child who needs additional support from adults at home to access remote education?

We recognise that some pupils, for example some pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), may not be able to access remote education without support from adults at home. We acknowledge the difficulties this may place on families, and we will work with parents and carers to support those pupils in the following ways:

Some pupils with EHCPs will be offered 1:1 or small group virtual support from a member of staff where possible. This will be organised and communicated with parents on a case by case basis.
